ACT ASPIRE - Mr. Mason Lawrence from the Cooperative Extension in Pasquotank County is teaching an ASPIRE class for juniors this spring to help them prepare for the February statewide ACT administration. ASPIRE is a 30 hour ACT prep course to help rural students increase their ACT scores. The course includes 30 hours of instruction in all ACT subject hours and students take 4 full-length practice ACT tests. The cost is \$165.00 with a \$100.00 refund if students complete the program fully. Eligible students should have a 3.2 minimum unweighted GPA.
