The curriculum focuses on the exploration of the most recent ideas and concepts in each discipline, and does not involve credit, tests, or grades.

To be eligible to apply for the London Scholarship, applicants must have an unweighted grade point average of 3.5 and score at least 1200 on the math and language sections of the SAT. Betty-Goah Scholarship – Congratulations to Sarah Baker for being awarded the Betty Goah Scholarship at Milligan College in eastern Tennessee for the amount of \$31,300 per year for four years for a grand total of \$125,200!
